#### FROM THE RECTOR

"Its stump is a holy seed (Is. 6:13)"

Last fall I trimmed back our hedges at home—they were getting overgrown. Earlier this year they were putting out significant new growth. But then Winter Storm Uri hit in February. And all the old green leaves and all the new green leaves turned brown. I thought my entire hedge was dead.

But then 2 of the 18 showed some tiny signs of growth—little green shoots were coming up at the bottom of these two plants. So I got out the chainsaw and took all the plants down to about 6" stumps. And now 16 of the 18 plants are showing signs of life. It'll be a while until they form a full hedge again. But there is hope.

In the  $6^{th}$  chapter of Isaiah, the prophet is told that God will send his people into exile. Their cities will be in ruins, and their land will be devastated. It'll be like a tree that is cut down. But then, at the very end of the chapter, the final few words in Hebrew are like a sprig of hope: "Its stump is a holy seed."

We've been through a long COVID winter, one that has lasted more than a year. But now, we're starting to see sprigs of hope growing in a season of new springtime. Those sprigs have not yet reached full maturity. But we can perceive light at the end of the tunnel. And as more and more people get vaccinated, we can start to increasingly phase-in to greater degrees of normality.

At St. Paul's, we're seeing new growth. Not only have we had the joy of seeing returning members whom we've missed. We've also had a number of new folks who have joined us even in the midst of a long COVID winter, even though their primary experience of St. Paul's at first was through a streamed service on the web (one of them was shocked that I was much taller than I appeared on the small screen!). We're still waiting to greet other returning members who are still waiting for conditions to normalize, but we're getting closer to that day all the time.

There's a newer Easter hymn in our hymnal (#204, sung to the tune of an old French Christmas carol), "Now the green blade riseth." It poetically compares the resurrection of Jesus Christ to new life that arises from seemingly dead seeds. The second verse says,

In the grave they laid him, Love whom hate had slain, thinking that never he would wake again, laid in the earth like grain that sleeps unseen:

Love is come again like wheat that springeth green.

But the final verse speaks of the new life we can experience:

When our hearts are wintry, grieving, or in pain, thy touch can call us back to life again, fields of our hearts that dead and bare have been:

Love is come again like wheat that springeth green.

May our Risen Lord bring new life and new growth to all of us.






